As we look back on 2022 and look forward to our 50th Anniversary season, I am immensely proud of the perseverance and dedication of volunteers and supporters. Your faithfulness to our missions continues to amaze me and for that I am extremely grateful. Little did those original 12 members know back in 1973 that 50 years later, their seed of an idea to start a community theatre group would result in the huge success and stalwart non-profit organization that it is today. I'm sure you are as excited as I am to look towards the future of PPP as we also celebrate our past.

In 2022, happy to be back inside on the stage, after the challenges that the COVID pandemic presented, we were able to present a season of thought-provoking and theatrically challenging productions that included the classic drama *TWELVE ANGRY JURORS*, the challenging musical *A GENTLEMAN'S GUIDE TO LOVE AND MURDER*, the Noel Coward comedy classic HAY FEVER, the very popular comedy *CALENDAR GIRLS* which sold-out six performances, the kickoff of our 50th Anniversary Celebration Season, and seven sold-out performances of Irving Berlin's *WHITE CHRISTMAS the Musical*. In addition, we began the observance of our 50th Anniversary with a Gala event fund-raiser, *LOVE MAKES THE WORLD GO 'ROUND –* a musical revue of songs from many of the musical productions of our 50 years.

We continue to be blessed with our affiliate groups that provide a schedule of wide-ranging opportunities to participate in the theatre experience outside our main-stage season. Hats off to the Possums Radio Theatre, Possum Juniors, PPP Shakespeare Players, Dreamers United and On The Edge who all continue to provide diverse theatre educational and entertainment options.

As a non-profit organization, we continue to persevere and meet all challenges. This has been made possible due to the generosity of our patrons, state and national grants, memberships and season subscriptions, and fund-raising events. We emerged from 2022 with a certain degree of financial stability and a continued commitment to our stated mission.





50th Anniversary Committee

This committee was formed in 2021 to work on our special anniversary celebration year. Michael Murnin, President at the time, appointed Nina Galerstein to be Chair. The committee consists of the following people: Louise Hartzell, Jon Sharp, Gwyneth Sharp, Beth Howlett, Kenney Workman, Rosanne Pack, Cat Baker, and Cheryl Graves.

Starting in the Fall of 2021 and throughout 2022 this committee met at least monthly and worked on many special projects (including choosing the shows for 2023, which will be discussed at the end of this list):

1) <u>Anniversary Gala Show</u>: This wonderful show, which encompassed music from many past shows, was directed by Kenney Workman (with Diane Trautman as musical director) and took place on October 8, 2022. There were 21 in the cast, plus Bob Kelso as Narrator (a past Possum, coming all the way from Asheville, NC). The show was almost sold out and fun for everyone involved!

This special evening also involved champagne and dessert (organized by Louise Hartzell and Cheryl Graves), a silent and live auction (organized by Cat Baker), the flute and violin duo of Nina Galerstein and Becky Elliott, an online auction of stuffed Possums dressed in past show outfits (sewn by Louise Hartzell, online support from John Zinzi), special birthday cake, and a lot of Hall decorations by the whole committee and office staff. The beautiful program was designed by Dawn Conaway.

2) <u>Scrapbook Project</u>: This involved taking all the loose photos and creating new scrapbooks, as well as fixing up old scrapbooks that needed some TLC. The project started with a clean-out of photos and articles by the Hartzell's, Beth Howlett and Nina. This was followed by many hours of fixing up the old scrapbooks and also creating a "History of PPP" scrapbook (which is now on a pedestal in the Hall lobby). These scrapbooks will be on display in the Green Room throughout 2023. The group that worked on this was Nina, Beth, Pat Hudson, and Sandy Browning.

- 3) <u>Puppet Videos</u>: Jim Hartzell was asked to create videos with the original "Carnival" puppets to be shown at the start of each show of our anniversary season. Jim created 5 of these and the first was shown at the Gala. Puppeteers were Beth Howlett, Bill Howlett, Louise Hartzell and Don Megee.
- 4) <u>Fundraising Through Sponsorship</u>: Jon and Gwyneth Sharp worked on this project, still ongoing, attempting to secure sponsors for each show of the anniversary season.
- 5) <u>Give-Aways For Each Show</u>: Nina organized all the extra PPP items from the gift shop that have not been sold and these are being given away at each show as a drawing.
- 6) <u>Big "5 0" in the Lobby</u>: This display was created by Nina, with the original painting done by Whitney Cook. The display itself was worked on by Sue Cassidy and Nina.
- 7) <u>Publicity</u>: Rosanne Pack worked diligently throughout the year ensuring that the media knew about everything we were doing. She also worked on the possibility of publicizing our theater group in different places, one being the screen ad for the Clayton Theater in Dagsboro, and the other WSDL.
- 8) <u>Exterior PPP Markee:</u> Cat Baker and Nina worked on a project for adding "50th Anniversary" to the sign, and Cat was able to find someone to do this for us.
- 9) <u>\$50 for the 50th</u>: The committee decided to embark on a fundraising campaign, starting in 2021, to raise \$20,000 to pay off the original mortgage. A fundraising speech was given at the start of each show to talk about the anniversary and ask for donations. Cat and Nina created the thermometer for this which is in the lobby. To date we have raised \$12, 500.
- 10) <u>Show Plaques:</u> In 2023 we will start selling our old show Plaques to anyone that wants them this is a future project. They have been organized and a few have been sold.

11) <u>Puppet Display</u>: Cat Baker got us the lobby Plexiglas display booth (donated) for the original "Carnival" puppets. These have been on display since the Fall of 2021 and will remain throughout the 2023 season.

2023 Show Season:

For this special season it was the 50th Anniversary Committee that chose the 5 main stage shows. These shows were going to be favorites from our past. (In addition, we also determined that the Possum Juniors should do the same: pick a summer show from our list of children's shows, we felt that would honor our history of children's theater). The shows we chose for the anniversary season are:

PPP Radio Theatre

In addition to having readings at Possum on the third Tuesday of each month, we did two live shows in 2022. At our live performances, we create the atmosphere of a network broadcasting studio complete with microphones, sound effects and transcribed music.

The first live performance was on September 8 at the annual Lewes Chautauqua Tent show. It was well-received, with a live audience of approximately 30 guests plus an undetermined number of viewers livestreaming on Facebook and on You Tube.

We did a show on October 27 at the Milford Public Library with about 35 guests. After a brief introduction to some of the popular shows of the "Golden Age of Radio", we presented an episode of Escape-Evening Primrose. This is a frightening tale of a popular department store where nighttime brings a horrifying alternate reality for an uninvited guest.

Our second feature was The Canterville Ghost, a classic ghost tale with an English haunted mansion involving a typical American family.




PPP Summer Camp Programs

Counselors, assistants, and helpers are PJ's, former PJ's, and often former campers. Over the course of the week, they work in groups on various theatre skills, exploring theatre history, various themes, singing, dancing and improvisation. Each group creates an original short play that presented at the end of the week as their grand finale...

With the relaxing of Covid restrictions over the summer months we combined the Theatre Academy & Drame Camp into 1 week. The theme being *HOORAY FOR HOLLYWOOD* introduced the golden years of Hollywood to our young campers. It was a joy hearing Possum Hall filled with children's laughter and watching them create their own interpretation of the Hollywood theme. In just 4 short days they pulled together 4 skits to be performed to a theatre filled with proud parents and family members.


Reading Committee

The Reading Committee typically begins work in April of the year, making a list of shows to read for the season that is 2 years in advance (so our 2022 RC was reading for 2024). The process of choosing plays involves a protocol we use every year to whittle down the list to approximately 25 that we read: large musicals, small musicals, comedies, mysteries, dramas, and holiday shows. We followed this procedure in 2022 with 17 members of the Reading Committee.

However, the timing of choosing the 2024 season differed this year. Because we are in our 50th Anniversary year and many of our members were working on multiple projects involving additional shows (such as our Anniversary Gala), we were not able to meet in the Fall to choose the 2024 season. We are meeting on Thursday January 5th, and the season will be announced shortly thereafter. As always, we will be choosing a season of 5 main stage shows.

As Reading Committee Chair, I am also responsible for the library. We continue to clean out and organize as needed, and this year we also worked on some archival projects such as our scrapbook collection. This will be discussed more in detail in my 50th Anniversary Report.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Our supporters have been good to us again this year and as you can see from the Annual Report Possum Point Players is in relatively good financial condition. We have had some very successful shows this year which has helped to keep our finances stable.

As a kickoff to our 50th anniversary year, the Gala brought in \$16,000 and we anticipate our 50th season to be successful as well.

We have accumulated \$130,000 toward the shop addition to our building. Work is expected to begin sometime in the beginning of 2023. We have presently paid off our old mortgage but have secured a loan to cover any additional construction costs for this building.

We have, however, had some very heavy expenses in recent months. We found that 3 of our 7 heating/air conditioning units had to be replaced at the cost of \$52,000. These units were very old, and it is understandable that they needed to be replaced. We only hope that the others, though they are older, hold up a few more years.

The inside of the theatre and the risers have been painted (\$6,100), we have added a new curtain on the stage (\$13,600) and carpeting is to be installed around the seating area and in the offices (\$7,000). We have also had some electrical work done and have replaced the overhead lights in the theatre and the shop area (\$2,500). New computers in the offices have also been purchased (\$2,500).

We are continuing to improve our facilities and hope that you all will help us keep them in good shape. Please remember to turn off all lights when leaving the building, lock all doors and clean up any trash. Your help is necessary to keep Possum Points Players the beautiful facility that it is today.
