


Director's Notes

Who knew that 34 years ago, when I performed in my first Possums' musical, I would arrive at this day – directing my favorite Broadway musical of all time, *Ragtime*. I first fell in love with the music of *Ragtime* when I purchased the original Broadway cast recording, knowing very little about it. Then, Rosanne, some friends and I went to see our dear friend Susan Powell, Miss America 1981, play Mother in a production at the Fulton Theatre in Pennsylvania – and I was hooked!!

At the heart of *Ragtime* is the story of three remarkable families – one upper middle-class white, one Jewish socialist immigrant, and one Harlem black – whose member's lives become dramatically entangled as they embark on personal voyages of self-discovery. Father, Mother, and Younger Brother, each searching for new horizons, eager to grow beyond the rigid limitations of their privileged society... Tateh, the immigrant artist, empowered only with his imagination to capture a piece of the American dream... and Coalhouse Walker Jr., the gifted ragtime musician who battles racial injustice to pave the path of freedom and dignity for his beloved Sarah, their infant son, and for future generations. As their journeys proceed, each becomes entwined with the lives of the era's most famous and colorful characters.

These themes are what attracted me to *Ragtime* – the way it addresses the great social issues of the twentieth century – racism, immigration, social violence, political activism, poverty, and women's rights – issues that we continue to struggle with today.

I hope you will enjoy our production – one that could not have happened without the help of many people. First, a big thank you to the Possum Point Players for allowing me this opportunity. Second, I have to personally thank my dear friends – Melanie and Aimee – for taking another of these crazy journeys with me. To the EXTREMELY talented cast and crew – thanks for bringing all of these characters to life. And, a special thank to Rosanne for her continued support and understanding and for tolerating my absences both physical and mental from the home-front for
